<b>Rule Number</b>	12.16.0.3 (e)
<b>Wording of current rule</b>	"No participant in the 50cc automatic class may compete in any other class other than at CLUB level competitions".

### **BACKGROUND TO THE REQUEST**

It would appear that at some "Interclub" competitions in NSW, junior riders have been allowed to compete on both 50cc and 65cc machines without penalty.

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### **INTENT OF THE RULE:**

The original intention of the rule was to allow riders taking part in 50cc events, but who were 7 years old, and also owned a 65cc machine, could use the 65cc at Club events to gain experience for when they shifted to this competition class.

There is a clear definition in the MA rule book between "Club" and "Interclub" events.



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## ACTUAL INTERPRETATION (WHAT THE RULE MEANS)

The current interpretation of this rule is that junior riders who are riding 50cc auto machines, cannot compete in any other capacity classes other than at CLUB competitions.

A Club meeting is interpreted as one club conducting an event that only members of that club can take part in.

A "Club" meeting does not mean "Interclub".

## RATIONALE:



This rule was introduced to allow young riders to gain experience on a bigger capacity machine in a club atmosphere where the numbers may be less.

## FURTHER ACTION THAT NEEDS TO BE TAKEN:

All SCB's will be informed of the interpretation, and will be asked to inform all officials acting as Clerks of Course and Stewards of the meaning of this rule.

Most SCB's responded in the affirmative.
